My Dear Parishioners, Friends of our parish, Brothers and Sisters,

It is often good to stand before a mystery of life and ponder it. Today we stand before the profound mystery of God: One God, three Persons, a mystery people have pondered since the beginning of time. Because God has been and should be a big part of our lives, we should ponder the mystery of God so as to understand God a little better, to be in awe, and to celebrate more profoundly the God we worship, love, listen to, desire to be with, and try to be like.

Who is this God that we worship? What does divine revelation tell us through Sacred Scriptures, the wonder of creation, or the Holy Spirit speaking in the hearts of people? The sources of our faith tell us that God exists: *I am who am* (Ex 3:14). God is eternal. God has always been. God will always be. They tell us that God is all-knowing. Wisdom and truth flow from God. *God is love* (1 Jn 4:16). God is unity and community: a Trinity of Persons. This naturally flows from God's love. Out of His love flows great mercy.

As Christians, we know that when we say this about God, we are saying it about the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. When we listen to the Scriptures we hear them as the one God speaking to us: *Before Abraham came to be, I am* (Jn 8:58). *Through him all things were made* (2 Col 1:16). *I am the way, the truth and the life* (Jn 14:6). *Love one another as I have loved you* (Jn 15:12). *May they be one as you, Father, are in me and I in you* (Jn 17:21). *When he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth* (Jn 15:13). *Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he will take from what is mine and declare it to you* (Jn 16:15). *Receive the Holy Spirit, whose sins you forgive are forgiven them* (Jn 20:23).

We come to understand that when we make these statements about God, we are making statements about our own lives. We exist because God exists. There is no life apart from God. The eternal God made us to have eternal life. His Spirit within us destines us for eternity. We are to strive to be holy as God is holy. God has empowered us to do good. We know what is good because God shares his wisdom with us. God commands us to love. He made us to love, to sacrifice, to be merciful and compassionate, to serve, and bless others. As love abounds in the Holy Trinity, so too, must love bind us as the Body of Christ, as one people before God. Yes, the mystery of our lives lies within the mystery of God.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit...



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

It is often heard that today's observance is an "idea feast," and that it is somewhat difficult to grasp its meaning. Other great solemnities, such as Christmas and Easter, have an easily grasped core. Yet, even though the Trinity is at the heart of our faith, firmly declared in the Creed since the Council of Nicea in 325, we are used to having people shrug and say, "Well, it's a mystery."

Perhaps it is more helpful to think of this as a "relationship feast," since it unveils our deepest identity. Dorothy Day was a great social reformer, pacifist, and ardent lover of the Trinity. When people told her that she would certainly be canonized one day (the process is indeed underway), she protested dismissively by remarking that people were raising a fuss just because she was not afraid to talk about God. She loved the Trinity, and treasured the traditional icon for the feast, also known as "The Hospitality of Abraham," depicting the three angelic beings seated at a table tilted toward the viewer and laden with bread and wine. For her, the Trinity revealed the heart of the Catholic life, three C's if you will: community, communication, and communion. That was not an "idea" for her, but what it means to be created in the image of the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

June is World Elder Abuse Awareness Month/ June 15th is World Elder Abuse Awareness Day

Every year in the United States, an estimated 5 million seniors are victims of elder abuse, neglect, or exploitation. Experts believe that for every case of elder abuse or neglect reported, as many as 23 cases remain unreported. What is Elder Abuse? · any act which causes harm to an older person and is carried out by someone whom the victim knows and trusts

financial abuse/exploitation—using someone’s money, property, or other assets illegally or improperly (stealing, forgery, identity theft, etc.), or forcing someone to change his or her will or sign documents (property transfers, loans, Power of Attorney, etc.)

psychological/emotional abuse—using threats, humiliation, name-calling, or harassment

physical abuse—inflicting pain or injury by hitting, slapping, pushing, kicking, or using restraints

neglect—failing to provide basic necessities (hygiene, food, clean and appropriate clothing, medical aids, etc.)

Who is At Risk? Elder abuse can happen to anyone regardless of socio-economic background, culture, or race. It can also occur anywhere: in a person’s home, in nursing homes, in assisted living facilities, and in hospitals. Based on available information, women and “older” elders (80 years old and older) are more likely to be victimized, and mistreatment is most often perpetrated by family members.

Some common risk factors include:

- The victim has dementia and/or is in poor physical health.
- The perpetrator and/or the victim have mental health or substance abuse issues.
- The victim is isolated and/or lives in a remote community.
- The victim’s family has difficulty coping with stress and conflicts, and/or has a history of domestic violence.
- The victim’s family has high financial and emotional dependence on the victim.
- The victim has poor literacy and/or limited awareness of his or her rights.
