## A Few Words From Our Pastor.....

My Dear Parishioners, Brothers and Sisters,

Nicodemus was one of the major characters of the Gospel, though he was never formally a disciple of Jesus. He watched Jesus' activity, and he listened to what He said. He was convinced that Jesus is the Prophet and so he wanted to talk to Him. He came to Jesus in the night and He offered him that time for conversation. Nicodemus took advantage of this unique chance to meet with the Son of God, who knew the way to full happiness.

The condition, however, to take advantage of this opportunity was to believe in two truths. First of all, we have to believe in Christ dying on the cross. To help Nicodemus, Jesus reminded him about the copper serpent, which Moses made in the desert, wanting to save people attacked by poisonous snakes. A look at the brass serpent kept the Israelites alive, by the will of God,

Nicodemus, as a Jewish teacher, knowing that story from the Old Testament well, was better prepared to receive the death of Christ on the cross than the Apostles. Being a teacher in Israel, he first saw the meaning of the saving death of Christ, and therefore, on Good Friday, he stood up with Jesus with great courage, taking part in his funeral.

The second truth that Jesus presents to Nicodemus concerns the love of God as a condition of salvation. Christ tells him: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him would have eternal life." In this sentence, Jesus shows the very foundation of Christian faith, which is the truth about God's incomprehensible love. The Father gave His Only-begotten Son, the Son in turn will give His life, and all because God loves the world. Nicodemus saw in salvation the love of God offered by Him in Christ. On the face of Yahweh, the Just Judge, who spoke in the Old Testament, Jesus showed the smile of a loving Father, full of mercy, who did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through Him.

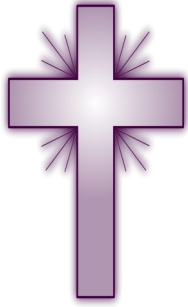
Courage is growing in the love of the truth. Nicodemus, decided in the first conversation with Jesus, entered the path of inner certainty that no one had taken away from him. Following his conscience, he met Jesus and, strengthened by this meeting, adapted his progress to the requirements of the Gospel.

Whoever seeks the truth and has the courage to think independently, sooner or later will meet a man who will help him find the right place in life. A conversation with him will fill him with a certainty whose foundation is God – the Truth in its pure form. The conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus is one of the fundamental themes of Church history, and truth-seeking people find assurance of their way of life. Nicodemus is also the model by which we should build our Christian courage.

I offer my heartfelt thanks to you for all that you do for Sacred Heart Parish, for your sacrifice and support. I will remember you in my everyday prayers, and I ask you to pray for me too, please.

May God reward you with His blessing and graces!

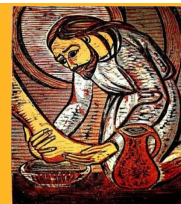

## Are You Registered?

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic Community and to make a commitment in all its dimensions. 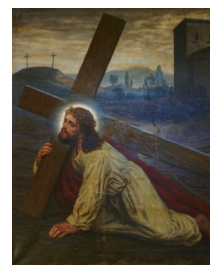
