Dear parishioners, Sisters & Brothers,

In 1263 a German priest, Fr. Peter of Prague, made a pilgrimage to Rome. He stopped in Bolsena, Italy, to celebrate Mass at the Church of St. Christina. At the time he was having doubts about Jesus being truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. He was affected by the growing debate among certain theologians who, for the first time in the history of the Church, began introducing doubts about the Body and Blood of Christ being actually present in the consecrated bread and wine. In response to his doubt, when he recited the prayer of consecration as he celebrated the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, blood started seeping from the consecrated host and onto the altar and corporal. Fr. Peter reported this miracle to Pope Urban IV, who at the time was nearby in Orvieto. The pope sent delegates to investigate and ordered that host and blood-stained corporal be brought to Orvieto. The relics were then placed in the Cathedral of Orvieto, where they remain today.

This Eucharistic Miracle confirmed the visions given to St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon in Belgium (1193-1258). St. Juliana was a nun and mystic who had a series of visions in which she was instructed by Our Lord to work to establish a liturgical feast for the Holy Eucharist, to which she had a great devotion.

She finally convinced the future Pope Urban IV, to create this special feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament,

where none had existed before. Pope Urban instituted Corpus Christi for the Universal Church and celebrated it for the first time in Orvieto in 1264, a year after the Eucharistic Miracle in Bolsena.

Also Pope Urban commissioned St. Thomas Aquinas, to compose the Mass, Office for the feast of Corpus Christi, and hymns in honor of the Holy Eucharist; *Pange Lingua, Tantum Ergo, Panis Angelicus, and O Salutaris Hostia*.

In the fourteenth century the custom developed of carrying the Blessed Sacrament in a splendid procession through the town after the Mass on Corpus Christi Day. The Council of Trent solemnly approved and recommended the procession on Corpus Christi as a public profession of the Catholic faith in the real presence of Christ in the Holy Sacrament.



They are still publicly held, and often with the ancient splendor, in Italy, France, Spain, Portugal, Austria, Belgium, Ireland, in the Catholic sections of Germany, Holland, Switzerland, Canada, Hungary, Poland and other Slavic countries and South America. Government officials, presidents and ministers of the state, magistrates, and honor guards of the armed forces accompany the liturgical procession while the church bells peal, bands play sacred hymns, and the faithful kneel in front of their homes to adore the Eucharistic Lord. The houses along the route of the procession are decorated with little birch trees and green boughs. Candles and pictures adorn the windows; and in many places, especially in Latin countries, the streets are covered with carpets of grass and flowers, often wrought in beautiful designs. The feast of Corpus Christi Procession is one time when our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament is exposed not just to faithful Catholics but to all the world. This is a time when Catholics can show their love for Christ in the Real Presence by honoring Him in a very public way. It is also a wonderful way in which we can show our love for our neighbors by bringing Our Lord and Savior closer to them.

Our Sacred Heart Parish will hold its Corpus Christi Procession (bilingual) on Sunday, June 11, after 12:00 Mass. We invite all of you to join us in this most glorious display of our veneration and belief that Jesus is present in the Eucharist. At the conclusion of Mass, the Blessed Sacrament will be processed out of the church and onto the grounds.

The procession should move at a slow and reverent speed through the designated route around Sacred Heart Parish campus and we will stop four times to listen to the passages from the Gospel. At the conclusion of the procession, we will stop at the statue of Sacred Heart of Jesus near our church for the Benediction.

I offer my heartfelt thanks to you for all that you do for Sacred Heart Parish, for your sacrifice and support. I remember you in my everyday prayers, and I ask you to pray for me too, please. May God reward you with His blessing and graces!

Drodzy Parafianie, Siostry i Bracia,

W 1263 r. niemiecki ksiądz ks. Piotr z Pragi odbył pielgrzymkę do Rzymu. Zatrzymał się w Bolsenie we Włoszech, aby odprawić Mszę Św. w kościele św. Krystyny. W tym czasie miał wątpliwości, czy Jezus jest rzeczywiście obecny w Najświętszym Sakramencie. Był poruszony dyskusjami wśród niektórych teologów, którzy po raz pierwszy w historii Kościoła zaczęli wątpić w to czy Ciało i Krew Chrystusa są rzeczywiście obecne w konsekrowanym chlebie i winie. W odpowiedzi na jego wątpliwości, w czasie konsekracji podczas sprawowania Najświętszej Ofiary Mszy, krew zaczęła sączyć się z konsekrowanej hostii na ołtarz i korporał. Ks. Piotr zgłosił ten cud papieżowi Urbanowi IV, który w tym czasie przebywał w pobliżu Orvieto. Papież wysłał delegatów w celu zbadania sprawy i nakazał sprowadzenie Hostii i zakrwawionego korporału do Orvieto. Relikwie zostały następnie umieszczone w katedrze w Orvieto, gdzie pozostają do dziś.

Ten cud eucharystyczny potwierdził wizje św. Juliany z Mont Cornillon w Belgii (1193-1258). Św. Juliana była zakonnicą i mistyczką, która miała szereg wizji, w których została poinstruowana przez Pana Jezusa, aby pracowała nad ustanowieniem liturgicznego święta Eucharystii, do której miała wielkie nabożeństwo. W końcu przekonała przyszłego papieża Urbana IV do stworzenia tego szczególnego święta ku czci Najświętszego Sakramentu, którego wcześniej nie było. Papież Urban ustanowił Boże Ciało dla Kościoła Powszechnego i po raz pierwszy odprawił je w Orvieto w 1264 roku, rok po Cudzie Eucharystycznym w Bolsena.

W XIV w. rozwinął się zwyczaj noszenia Najświętszego Sakramentu w procesji przez miasto po Mszy Św. w Boże Ciało. Sobór Trydencki uroczyście zatwierdził i zalecił procesję na Boże Ciało jako publiczne wyznanie wiary katolickiej w rzeczywistą obecność Chrystusa w Najświętszym Sakramencie.

Uroczyste procesje na Boże Ciało wciąż spotkamy we Włoszech, Francji, Hiszpanii, Portugalii, Austrii, Belgii, Irlandii, w katolickich częściach Niemiec, Holandii, Szwajcarii, Kanady, Węgier, Polski i innych krajów słowiańskich i Ameryce Południowej. Podczas procesji liturgicznej towarzyszą urzędnicy państwowi, prezydenci i ministrowie państwa, urzędnicy i straż honorowa sił zbrojnych, biją dzwony kościelne, orkiestry grają święte hymny, a wierni klęczą przed swoimi domami, aby adorować Pana Jezusa w Eucharystii. Domy na trasie procesji ozdobione są brzózkami i zielonymi konarami. Świece i obrazy zdobią okna; a w wielu miejscach, zwłaszcza w krajach łacińskich, ulice pokrywają dywany z trawy i kwiatów, często zdobione pięknymi wzorami. Święto Procesji Bożego Ciała to jeden raz, kiedy nasz Pan w Najświętszym Sakramencie jest wystawiony nie tylko na wiernych katolików, ale na cały świat. To czas, kiedy katolicy mogą okazać miłość do Chrystusa obecnego pośród nas. Jest to również wspaniały sposób, w jaki możemy okazać naszą miłość bliźnim, przybliżając im naszego Pana i Zbawiciela.

<u>Procesja Bożego Ciała (dwujęzyczna)</u> w naszej parafii odbędzie się w niedzielę 11 czerwca po Mszy św. o godz. 12:00. Po zakończeniu Mszy św. wyjdziemy z Najświętszym Sakramentem na teren naszej parafii i w uroczystej procesji pójdziemy do czterech ołtarzy. Będą nimi dobrze nam znane cztery figury Matki Bożej i Pana Jezusa. Procesyjnie, z godnością będziemy poruszać się wyznaczoną trasą na terenie naszej parafii i zatrzymując się cztery razy, będziemy słuchać fragmentów Ewangelii. Na zakończenie procesji zatrzymamy się przy figurze Najświętszego Serca Pana Jezusa obok kościoła na końcowe błogosławieństwo.

Serdecznie dziękuję wam za wszystko, co robicie dla parafii Najświętszego Serca, za wasze poświęcenie i wsparcie. Polecam Was Bogu w moich codziennych modlitwach i proszę Was również o modlitwę za mnie. Niech Bóg wynagrodzi Wam swoim błogosławieństwem i łaskami!






